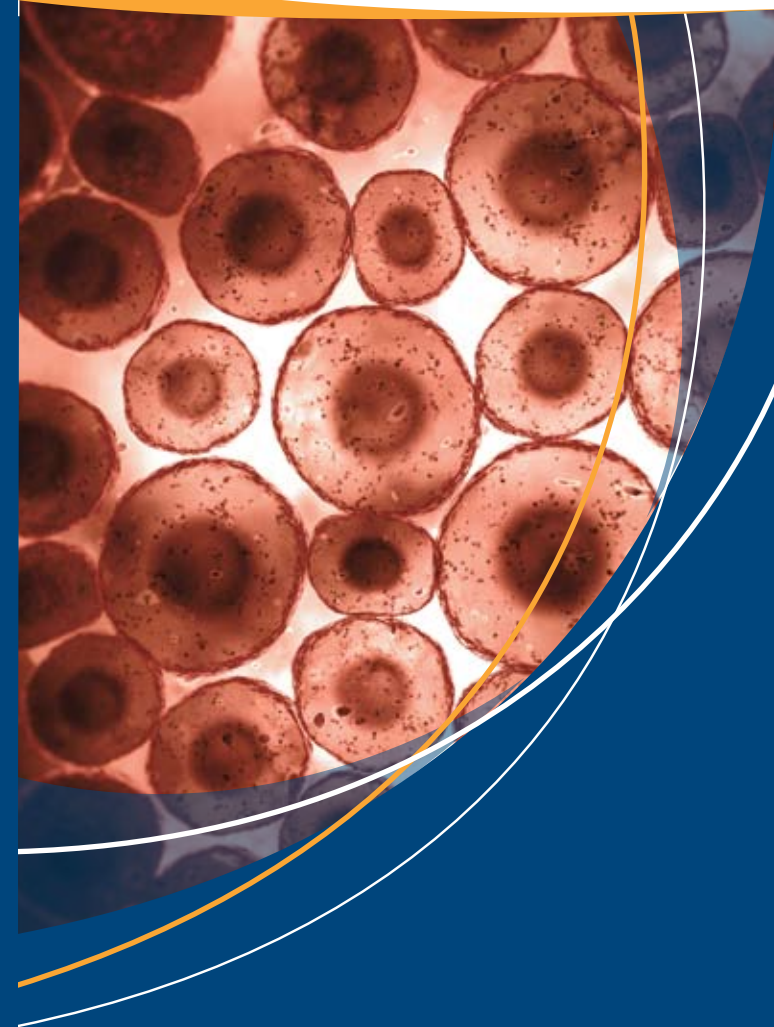

When you're embarking on a pregnancy, it's essential to prepare physically. Firstly, have you had your immune status for infections such as Rubella (German Measles) and Hepatitis B checked?

In addition, it is important to test for Hepatitis C & Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). Although vaccination against these viruses is currently unavailable, it's essential for the baby's well being to know about possible infections as early as possible in a pregnancy.

If you have not been immunized for Rubella or your immunity has declined, it is vital to be vaccinated prior to commencing treatment to protect the health of the baby. Following vaccination, you will need to wait at least a month for immunity to be confirmed. This may delay commencement of treatment until immunity is confirmed.
